"To plant a garden is to believe in tomorrow", Audrey Hepburn Here are a couple of quotes which I researched recently. The first one resonates with those of us who have gardened all our lives and those who have only recently found enjoyment in doing it. We don't think of Audrey Hepburn as a gardener, do we? That's why I think it is particularly pertinent now...

Welcome to July, the month according to gardening books that allows you to cash in on relaxation, enjoyment and the colour and scent of the garden. So whether this season is your first attempt at gardening or you are an avid, experienced gardener, this month is supposedly your time.

Borders should be extravagant with large bushes of alchemilla and purple sage. Take the chance during the day to enjoy your verbena bonariensis and penstemon, your alstroemeria and osteospermum. Have an early evening drink surrounded by asters and lysimachia and if you have been really lucky, your spiky eryngiums. During the evening, take pleasure in smelling your lilies and dianthus. And generally just enjoy your phlox, campanulas, salvias and clematis. Maybe even your roses.

During the Covid-19 pandemic we will be offering the following services

Collection and Delivery of Shopping from Orford General Store

We can arrange for a volunteer to pick up pre-ordered items from Orford General Store and deliver them to your doorstep. You must avoid contact with our volunteers so the items **must** be ordered either online or by telephone and paid for by bank card.

Medical Prescriptions from the Peninsula Practice

We can pick your medication up and post it through your letterbox or leave it outside on the doorstep if large. If you are under 60 and pay for your medication you must ring the surgery pharmacy and pay using a bank card. If you are under 60 and have a medical exemption, we will need the exemption number. We need to know your Name, Address and Date of Birth in order to collect your prescription.

<u>Transportation to GP or Hospital Appointments</u>

This is only available to clients who are not presenting symptoms of Covid-19.
