ORFORD AND DISTRICT GARDENING CLUB *The Vegetable Garden*

Our May talk on Zoom was by Lou Nicholls, Head Gardener at Ulting Wick. She spoke about her organic approach, avoiding chemicals and told us of her career with the Heritage Seed Library at Ryton and at Sissinghurst where she made the organic approach more accessible and created Fred, the Scarecrow!

She gave us an overview of growing under cover and told us the story of the Victorian 'Pineapple Boy' who slept in with the pineapples in the cold frame, woke up when he got cold and then stoked the boiler!

Lou recommended 'enviromesh' as the best way to keep pigeons, whitefly etc at bay and suggested we use straw rather than black plastic for keeping weeds down. She also spoke of companion planting with Tagetes and Nasturiums so that the pests go for them and not your crops.

She spoke of the 10 vegetable families, crop rotation and using green manures — I think we all learned a lot from this.

On the afternoon of 10 June, Mike and I will open our 'wild' garden for a low-key Garden Party, with cakes and a 'bring and buy' stall too. This will be a great opportunity for members to socialise after such a long time...

Mannington Hall Gardens Norfolk - Rose specialists

On Wednesday 7 July we plan to go, by coach, to the estate of Lord and Lady Walpole for a private visit including a talk about the garden. It nestles in the Norfolk countryside and has a renowned Heritage Rose Garden created by Lord Walpole in the 1980s with over 1000 varieties of roses arranged in their date or origin. There is also a wildflower meadow with over 150 species of flora and boardwalks and bird hides. The Saxon chapel ruins can be seen with an outstanding array of native and foreign tree species.

QUIET LANES PROJECT

Dear Resident/Business Owner

Orford and Gedgrave Parish Council, is exploring opportunities to designate certain rural lanes in the village as "Quiet Lanes" as part of a county wide project.

Quiet Lanes are a nationally recognised designation for narrow, rural roads which are shared by walkers, horse riders, cyclists and other road users. They encourage drivers to 'Expect and Respect' more vulnerable road users and so allow non-motorised users to enjoy rural lanes in greater safety.




These types of lanes do not impose traffic restrictions (including speed limits) and are not enforced. Advisory signs (as illustrated) are placed at either end of Quiet Lanes to show motorised users clearly that the road is a shared space.

We feel that this would be of real benefit to the village and those who visit. The lanes being considered are already used by walkers, cyclists and horse riders and link with existing footpaths and bridleways in the village.

We have identified, in conjunction with Suffolk County Council (Highways), Raydon Lane, Bullockshed Lane, Ferry Road, Mill Broadway and Gedgrave Road, as being suitable for designation – see lanes marked in bold on the map.

If you wish to make any comments about these proposals at this initial stage, we would welcome these in writing either by email to the Parish Council Clerk (orfordtownhall@btconnect.com) or by post to Orford and Gedgrave Parish Council, Orford Town Hall, Orford IP12 2NZ.

As part of the formal public consultation process there will be a Parish public meeting on 14 July 2021 at 7pm to discuss these proposals. Please you send your comments in time to be reviewed by the parish council before that meeting.


