### THE QUEEN'S PLATINUM JUBILEE CHORAL EVENSONG

Before the temporary Covid setback, cathedrals all over the country had been reporting increasing numbers of visitors for Choral Evensong: attendance grew 34 percent in ten years, signalling that Choral Evensong's recitation of timeless, poetic words, combined with wonderful music, was able to reach into the hearts and minds of both the faithful, seekers after spiritual connection, and people who just come to listen.

In Orford we are tremendously lucky to have regular choral services with our fine choir and magnificent organ. St Bartholomew's Church welcomes you to a special Queen's Platinum Jubilee Choral Evensong with choir and organ on Sunday 5 June at 6pm. We will be singing exclusively British music, beginning with a short but spectacular anthem written in 1947 by Sir William McKie, Master of the Music at Westminster Abbey, for the marriage of HRH The Princess Elizabeth and Lieutenant Philip Mountbatten in the Abbey. It's short because the King had insisted that the wedding should last no longer than 55 minutes! There's music written by Herbert Howells for the Choir of King's College, Cambridge and the centrepiece will be the anthem 'I was glad' by Hubert Parry (with solo trumpeter in Orford), written for the Coronation of King Edward VII in 1902 and used at every British coronation ever since. The service will also contain well-known congregational hymns. After this service, the Choir takes its summer break, resuming in September. All are welcome to come and help mark the Jubilee in fine musical style!

#### **SUDBOURNE HALL CRICKET CLUB**

Aside from one delayed start after a heavy Saturday morning downpour, Sudbourne Hall have enjoyed a clear run of fixtures since the league season began on the Easter weekend. Unfortunately, the club have enjoyed a less than auspicious start to the season on the pitch, currently sitting near the foot of the Two Counties Division Six with one win and four defeats from their opening five games.

The stand-out display came at home to Felixstowe in late April, a thrilling game when Sudbourne chased down 184 with 2 wickets and 2 overs to spare. Richard Daykin with a hat trick and Charlie Jackson with 76 were the saviours for the home team. Fair to say the side have been dogged by inconsistency with both bat and ball so far. Skipper Ed Robson was more encouraged with the most recent showing, a 56-run loss away to league leaders, Bardwell. With Sudbourne staring down the barrel after Bardwell reached 90 for 1 off only 10 overs, they managed to restrict the home side to 199 all out with tight bowling and some excellent catches. In reply, a swashbuckling 48 from Sam Mann was sadly followed by wickets falling regularly. With Daykin unbeaten on 31, the away side finished the innings on 143 for 9. A more positive performance than recent weeks. Sudbourne will certainly be hoping to start climbing the league through the summer months.

#### **ORFORD HOUSING**

Clear evidence of a failure to protect Orford as an important part of the Suffolk Coast and Heaths Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB), which is the setting for Orford, is now clear to see. The development of houses on land North of Mill Close is taking shape and I understand it is not what Orford wanted or needed. The scheme appears to have no affordable houses or houses likely to be affordable to people with local jobs. This development should not have been the way to provide housing in Orford where many existing houses stand empty or not fully used. Infill schemes of houses on small sites would be preferable to this new 11 house scheme on what was open agricultural land. The Planning Officer for the AONB said "We do not consider that

as proposed the scheme will sit sympathetically within the AONB landscape", but her objection along with others was disregarded.

Valid objections by myself and others failed to stop this development but even the present scheme design could have been improved yet the Planning Authority failed to take note of our suggestions. I agreed with a suggestion that that there should be a focal open space with groups of houses around or terraces like other parts of Orford and the scale of building could relate to neighbouring houses to reduce overlooking and visual impact.

Local support is needed to protect this valuable part of the AONB which is intended to be as good as part of a National Park. Everyone living in or visiting Orford benefits from the AONB but if we all continue to ignore this gradual erosion by greenfield development along country roads it will inevitably end up becoming ribbon development.

This is an issue affecting many other villages. Is this what we want? **John Donnelly**, retired architect

#### **ORFORD AND DISTRICT GARDENING CLUB**

Peter Maddison Butterfly Conservation

Our May meeting, which was attended by a record number of current members, new members and guests, was a real education by Peter on Butterflies – what a lot we all didn't know! Apparently, there are 59 species in the UK of which we have 35 in Suffolk, and Orford and Sudbourne is the only place where you can now see the Wall Brown – particularly in the north east corner of St Bart's Churchyard! If you spot any, please record on www.butterfly-conservation.org

We can help maintain and increase the number and species of butterflies in our area by growing these particular plants: Verbena bonariensis, Sedum 'Spectacle', garlic mustard, buddleia Globosa Dartmoor Weyeriana', Erysimum 'Bowles Mauve', marjoram, lavender, Birds Foot Trefoil and willow catkins. Please keep your nettles – those that are in the sun and grasses for over the winter. Single flowers are best for butterflies. An area which is just left wild helps to support the caterpillars as they develop as they need food too! Late morning and lunchtime while it is warm are the best times to see butterflies – so far we've had the Orange Tip, Red Admiral, Peacock and Holly Blue in our garden. Peter said that 'Priors Oak' in Aldeburgh supports their work and will be open on 31 July – a great time to see the butterflies on the huge number of varieties of buddleias there.


