### **HOUSING IN ORFORD**

Further to the letter in February's Village Voice regarding a social housing property in Ferry Road being sold on the open market, the Parish Council wrote to the owners of the property, Flagship Homes, in December 2021. In their reply they reassured us that the proceeds of the sale would be invested back into affordable housing, suggesting that the investment would, again, follow their wider area strategy rather than replacing what will be lost in Orford – i.e., the proceeds will support a community but not **our** community. These **non-local decisions** not to let the property to the Orford resident 2 years ago and now its subsequent sale, **have now lost Orford a house.** 

This is very uncomfortable for us to accept. Strong, sustainable, and affordable communities are built on strong family networks. Keeping local affordable housing available to local people is the best way to support that aim. We understand that the tenants (a local family) who moved out 2 years ago wanted to buy the property but were turned down as it was not the housing association's policy to sell properties. Flagship has said that their preference when selling properties is to offer them to like-minded organisations with either a strong social purpose, local presence, or long-term interest in the area, but Orford and Gedgrave Parish Council, which might have been able to help with this, was not informed that the property was going to be sold. We are sure Flagship can't be expected to know of all these
