#### **FRIENDS GARAGE UPDATE**

The new proposed plans for the Friends Garage site, which can be viewed online at https://artisan-pps.co.uk/orford/, are **not** the result of negotiations with the Community Interest Group and have come out of the blue, apparently precipitated by the separate sale and development of the Seaforth House site adjacent to the commercial Friends Garage site. The Seaforth house plot had been a fundamental part of the project up to now and was the site earmarked for the shop and post office. The removal of the Seaforth house site from the project means the plan and negotiations have to be started again.

The Friends Garage site retains its Community Asset status as a commercial site, and we anticipate continued full support from East Suffolk Coastal in ensuring that the commercial element of the site is protected. Any housing on the site is contingent on an acceptable commercial element – in this case a larger, workable village shop, post office and vehicle recharging facility.

The preliminary concerns regarding the proposals are as follows:

- The space proposed for the shop, post office and customer parking element is insufficient and unviable.
- There is no access for delivery of goods to the shop.
- While the existing garage site is unsightly, the proposed designs for the residences and shop are poor and uninspiring. Their facings and window design are more appropriate in a low-cost urban setting, rather than a village noted for the charm of its built environment.

Orford's CIC group (Community Interest Company) will continue discussions with the developer and site owner and expect the ongoing support of East Suffolk Council and the Parish Council.

# **ORFORD MUSEUM**

Now that Orford Castle has returned to its normal opening pattern, we are able once again to welcome visitors to the Museum on the first floor of the Castle. Currently, the Castle is open only at weekends but will re-open fully seven days a week in Spring 2022. We have at last, after protracted negotiations, been able to set a date for the Orford stocks to move to their new home in the Museum. On 8 November they will be taken from Dick Murphy's workshop in Sudbourne Park to the Castle where they will be displayed protected by a specially made Perspex cover as they are at least three hundred years old and very delicate. There will also be an information sheet explaining their use and the restoration work undertaken by Dick for which we are all very grateful. They actually belong to the NOTT and therefore to the village and we very much hope that they will be able to stay in their new home for many years to come.

Orford Museum now has a new Chairman. Sue Snowdon, who everyone knows as the proprietor of the wonderful Orford Stores, Chair of Orford CEVAP School governors and many other things besides has very kindly agreed to take over from me and I am most grateful to her and I do wish her well. I shall stay on as a Trustee for the time being to assist Sue with the hand-over. We also have a new Curator. Jenna Ingamells, who has been doing this job admirably for the last four years, now has a very much more demanding job with the Suffolk County Council Museums' Service and this, together with the demands of a young family, has made it impossible for her to carry on with us. However, we have been lucky enough to find the ideal replacement. Stephen Mael who is currently working part-time for Aldeburgh Museum has now joined us as Curator. Stephen, who was born in Iken and went to

school in Orford, Butley and Woodbridge will work for us initially for two days a week. He has extensive experience working in museums and is deeply interested in local history so we have been very lucky to find him. We hope soon to be able to organise exhibitions and open days as we used to. We also hope to set up other collaborative projects with Aldeburgh Museum as so much of Orford's history is entwined with that of Aldeburgh. I do urge people to visit the newly re-furbished Aldeburgh Museum in the Moot Hall. They have done many of the things we would like to do and it is most impressive.

We would love to resurrect the Friends of Orford Museum and re-start publication of our renowned Orford & District Local History Bulletin and to this end we are, as usual, looking for volunteers from the village who might be interested in joining our team to help with this. We have a possible editor for the Bulletin waiting in the wings – all we need is more help with administration. Another important benefit that the Friends enjoy is free entry to the Castle and it is such a shame that, at the moment, we cannot make use of this.

We would also like to strengthen our Trustee board and anyone with an interest in local history would be very welcome. We would particularly like to hear from new residents in the village and surrounding area who might like to learn more about Orford's history.
