ORFORD MUSEUM EVENTS AT BUTLEY PRIORY

On Thursday 6 November, well-known journalist and Woodbridge resident, Simon Pearson, will talk about his book 'The Great Escaper: the Life and Death of Roger Bushell' which tells the story of Roger Bushell – aka 'Big X' – the man who masterminded the 'Great Escape' in 1944 and was played by Richard Attenborough in the famous film twenty years later.

On Monday 24 November Iain Murison will give a talk entitled 'Afghanistan – a genuine and personal insight'. Iain joined the Corps of Royal Engineers in 1984 where he served for thirty years spending time in a variety of conflicts including Northern Ireland, Bosnia, Afghanistan, Iraq and Sierra Leone. He was shaped by his experiences and retired in 2014. This presentation is an insightful personal account of the most challenging and fulfilling campaign in recent years, a true testament of leadership through the most intense adversity.

On Monday 8 December, Alison Weir will talk about her international best-seller 'Eleanor of Aquitaine, By the Wrath of God Queen of England'. (This talk is now waiting list only.) Eleanor of Aquitaine was one of the leading personalities of the Middle Ages and one of the most controversial. She was beautiful, intelligent and wilful and in her lifetime there were scandalous rumours about her that were not without substance. She had been reared in a relaxed and licentious court where the arts of the troubadours flourished and was even said to have presided over the fabled Courts of Love. Eleanor married in turn Louis VII of France and Henry II of England and was the mother of Richard the Lionheart and King John. She lived to be eighty, but it was only in old age that she triumphed over the adversities and tragedies of her earlier years and became the virtual ruler of England.

Eleanor has exerted a fascination over writers and biographers for 800 years but the prevailing myths and legends that attach to her name still tend to obscure the truth. Drawing on extensive research and her best-selling biography, Alison Weir offers vivid, fresh and provocative perspective on this extraordinary woman.

All the talks start at 6pm and last about an hour. Tickets for Alison Weir's talk on Eleanor of Aquitaine cost £20 for Friends of Orford Museum and £25 for guests as they will include mulled wine and mince pies. Tickets for all the other talks cost £15 for Friends, £20 for guests and include a glass of wine (served from $5.30 \, \mathrm{pm}$). ALDEBURGH MUSIC CLUB CONCERT: HANDEL'S MESSIAH

Snape Maltings Concert Hall, Saturday 29 November 2025 at 7pm Aldeburgh Music Club – founded by Benjamin Britten in 1952 - returns to Britten's Snape Maltings Concert Hall on 29 November 29 with one of the greatest choral works of all time – Handel's *Messiah*.

First performed in 1742, *Messiah* has since become one of the best loved of all choral works, especially in its retelling of the Christmas story, a perfect start to the festive season. Amongst the many famous choruses are 'For unto us a child is born', 'Glory

to God', and of course the Hallelujah chorus, in which the audience traditionally stands and is invited to join in.

Aldeburgh Music Club Choir will be accompanied by the Suffolk Baroque Players, led by Kathryn Parry, and be joined by a brilliant quartet of locally-based professional soloists — Elenor Bowers-Jolley (soprano), Diana Moore (mezzo-soprano), Jonathan Hanley (tenor) and Rob Gildon (baritone). The performance will be conducted by the Club's Director of Music, Tom Appleton.

CONCERT IN ORFORD CHURCH

Saturday 13 December, 4pm

In September 2024 Hayden Thorpe released Ness. An album inspired by Orford Ness, a former Ministry of Defence site during both World Wars and the Cold War, it was acquired by the National Trust in 1993 and left to re-wild. To this day, it remains a place of paradox, mystery and constant evolution. Using a process of redaction, Thorpe brings the songs to life from the words of pioneering, best-selling place writer Robert Macfarlane's book of the same name. The album was launched with four powerful performances on the site itself as part of 'Ness Speaks', in collaboration with the National Trust, where Thorpe and his collaborators Propellor Ensemble delivered the music live for the first time to an audience, in a room containing a decommissioned nuclear bomb.

Thorpe returns to Orford in December 2025 to deliver a final performance of the work, with a brand-new choral collaboration. He will perform the work in its entirety with London's SYRINX Choir in St Bartholomew's Church. With this bespoke new choral arrangement, the final chapter of Ness beautifully bookends its journey, coming home to Orford where it all began.
